


Checkpoint-Paris : a biomedical study

“Feasibility study of community based medicalized rapid HIV-testing for MSM”

Targeted community based service, out of medical lab.

Medicalized Voluntary Counselling and Testing (VCT)


From Jan 28 2010 to Jan 27 2012





Rapid test result and confirmation diagnosis

Test and link to care strategy





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Activity : > 5 000 MSM tested at least once over 24 months


Around 1 100 patients have used Checkpoint several times (20%)

	Visits	Inclusions	Consultations
First year	2600	2342	2600
Second year	3200*	2900*	4000*
24 months	5800	5242*	6600*

Activity : Checkpoint-Paris is overcrowded ! (+25%)





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First year : 2 343 MSM.

Demographics :

Young men (median age 29, IQR : 24-36 ans),

Living in Paris and suburb (84 %),

Gay men (78 %) & bisexual men (15%),

Postgraduates (64 %),

Employed (77 %),

Wealthy (28 % over 2 500 € net monthly income).



Sexual behaviour (first year)

Sexually actives and exposed to HIV sexual transmission

With casual partners (86 %)

Exposed to sperm (oral sex) : 52%

UAI : 40%

With regular partner (57 %)

UAI : 37%

UAI with a positive or unknown serostatus partner : 30%




Testing before Checkpoint

First test : **13 %** (26 % < 25 ans)

Already tested : **87 %**

Last test median delay : **12 months** (IQR : 6-24 months)



Last test \leq 24 months	79 %
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Last test \leq 12 months	57 %
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Last test \leq 6 months	29 %
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HIV-1 positive patients over 24 months : 129 (all confirmed)

2,46 % [IC95 : 2,04 - 2,88 %]


Westen Blot reading :

31 early infections

19 recent infections (< 2 mois)

79 infections > 2 months

Incidence estimate : 1%

Link to care

Positive patient's access to immediate medical care : **99%**

	Year 1	Year 2	24 months
Lost	0	0	0
Refusal	1	0	1
Oriented to care	51	77	128



Link to care

Choices for immediate medical care :

	Année 1	Année 2	Total	Total %
Private practice	27	27	54	42 %
Hospital	6	31	37	29 %
Health center	13	13	26	20 %
Abroad	4	2	6	5 %
Unknown	1	4	5	4 %



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Checkpoint is attractive to :

- young urban gay men, highly educated (+ other MSM)
- already accustomed to testing (+ first test among younger MSM),
- exposed to HIV sexual transmission

Checkpoint is attractive because :

- rapid test
- community based service (gay)
- medical counselling

Link to care is effective

- strong link between HIV screening, diagnosis and medical care
- no lost patient
