Overcoming obstacles to optimal testing/earlier care

Barrier:

Action:

Medical practice

- People present too late to receive full benefit from care and treatment
- Public health
 - Human and financial costs associated with the undiagnosed ad late presentation
- Social environment
 - Stigma multi-faceted, complex issue

Incentives for service providers to optimise testing and counselling (applying "3 C's" principles)

Indicator Disease Guidance



Work to decriminalise HIV-related laws, including remove travel restrictions applying a human rights framework HIV in Europe 2007 Working Together for Outmail Teating and Earlier Corp

Other conclusions

- Different stakeholder groups → strength in collaboration, but this is a first step only
- More research is needed
- Better surveillance is needed
- More funding mechanisms are required
- Need to mobilise political leadership and influence EU and UN institutions to keep HIV high on political agendas
