Public consultation on BBV testing guidance



EuroTEST is currently developing practical implementation guidance for blood-borne virus (BBV) opt-out testing in emergency departments (EDs) across Europe. More information about this is available on the EuroTEST website. This project responds to European recommendations to expand routine testing for HIV, hepatitis B (HBV), and hepatitis C (HCV) in high-prevalence settings.

The aim of this guidance is to provide a practical, evidence-informed toolkit for implementing BBV testing in EDs across Europe. It draws on pilot experiences, a review of the literature, and expert input from a multidisciplinary advisory group including European agencies, clinicians, public health specialists, and community representatives. The final document will include key recommendations, case studies, stakeholder insights, and practical resources to support implementation across diverse health systems.

EuroTEST invites stakeholders to contribute to a public consultation on the draft guidance.

EuroTEST publications

The results of a EuroTEST study on hepatitis mortality estimates, conducted for ECDC, has been published in the journal Liver International: "Mortality Attributable to Hepatitis B and C in Italy, Romania, and Spain, 2022 Estimates" ([accessible here](#)).

The study examined mortality linked to hepatitis B and C in Italy, Romania, and Spain by analysing hospital records and national statistics. Findings show that in 2022, none of the three countries met WHO's 2025 interim target for hepatitis C-related mortality (no more than 3 deaths per 100,000 population). However, Italy and Spain did meet the corresponding target for hepatitis B (no more than 7 deaths per 100,000). These results provide important evidence for action by underlining the continued need to strengthen efforts in testing, prevention, and control of viral hepatitis, and provide valuable insights to help guide future public health strategies.
