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## OptTEST at the HepHIV 2017 Conference

The biennial HIV in Europe organized <u>HepHIV 2017 Conference</u> *HIV and Viral Hepatitis: Challenges of Timely Testing and Care* is held this year in Malta, during the 2017 Maltese Presidency of the Council of the EU. The presidency is hosting a technical meeting, Fast-track the end of AIDS in the EU: practical evidence-based interventions, from the 30th to the 31st January, 2017, in collaboration with the ECDC, for Member States and other key actors. It is expected that important synergies will arise between the presidency meeting and the HepHIV 2017 Conference.

The HepHIV Conference spans over three days and will hopefully generate lively discussions, innovative thinking and a renewed commitment of political action. OptTEST partners will be presenting results in different sessions during the conference, and the last day is a symposium sponsored by OptTEST with special focus on optimization of testing and linkage to care.
