Findings....





A picture has emerged of restrictive practices and regulations including:

- Lack of access to, and use of, proven new testing technologies and settings
- 'Questiónable' restrictions on who can administer tests
- Unnecessary requirement for extensive pre/post test counselling
- Refusal to accept referrals from community testing into care
- Limited testing sites and restricted types of test
- Wider barriers to improving the continuum of care included: separation of healthcare into vertical specialities (e.g. drugs care separate from HIV and from TB); lack of case management systems; failure to integrate healthcare and social support; disruption of care between civil and detention authorities.
- Complex entitlement regulations and charging systems deterring/excluding migrants, including even those entitled to healthcare sometimes.
